Siam Cement (SCC TB)

Razor-Thin Profits In 4Q22; Maintain BUY

- Maintain BUY and THB400 TP (DCF), 15% upside and >4% FY23F yield. After sudden simultaneous net profit losses from two major units (cement & building materials and petrochemicals) and bottomline disappointment from the packaging wing in 4Q22, we maintain our expectation that the recovery process will materialise in 2H23; therefore, we also see an FY23 earnings turnaround vs FY22's deep low base.
- Major slams in FY22's final guarter. Siam Cement booked a 4Q22 net profit of THB157m (-98% YoY, -94% QoQ) that missed our and Street's THB1bn and THB1.2bn estimates. As expected, the petrochemicals and cement & building materials units posted 4Q22 net losses while the packaging wing - which was previously anticipated as being the only survivor for this quarter - could not escape from regional market pressures. Asset impairment and inventory devaluation - arising from SCG Ceramic (COTTO TB, NR) temporarily suspending artificial stone production - and the high coal costs (used in cement production and procured during 1Q22's price spike) hammered out the cement & building materials unit with a THB717m loss. Similar to other regional petrochemical players, SCC's petrochemicals wing was pressured by weak sales volumes and shrinking polyolefin spreads - it ended up with a 4Q22 loss of THB1.05bn. Even worse, the packaging business was slashed by disappointing sales volumes in the integrated packaging chain and weaker GPM in the fibrous chain.
- As the petrochemicals industry has travelled from its mid-cycle in 1H22 to a low cycle in 2H22, SCC's quarterly earnings began to plunge in 3Q22. It worsened in 4Q22 as the cement & building materials and packaging wings were simultaneously hit by slower sales volumes and fuel cost spikes. Hence, FY22 earnings of THB21.4bn (-55% YoY) fell to their lowest level since the FY08's Global Financial Crisis.
- Likely recovery in FY23. After the deep low earnings in FY22 pressured by the worsened situations in all three businesses - we expect SCC's earnings situation to ease out within FY23, especially during 2H23. The positive signs for petrochemicals YTD: Major polyolefin spreads are sustaining despite volatile feedstock costs, while China's full re-opening should bode well for the demand situation for SCC's petrochemicals and packaging businesses. Although energy costs used in production remains our major concern, any pickup in the demand situation will inevitably stimulate earnings prospects in FY23, in our view.
- Based on our in-house proprietary methodology, we assign an ESG score of 3.70 for SCC, as SCC is committed to and has invested in ESG practices over the past decade. We derive an initially higher DCF-based THB370 and apply an ESG premium of 8% to arrive at our THB400 TP.



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Cement & building materials hit by fuel costs and large provisions

For the domestic cement industry, overall demand in 4Q22 increased 3% YoY due to the low-base effect in 4Q21, which was caused by the halting of construction activities during the intense pandemic crisis. Demand from the public sector increased 4% YoY, while private sector demand in the residential and commercial segments also rose 2% and 3% YoY. In addition, average domestic cement prices increased 2.5% QoQ to the THB2,000-2,050 per tonne range in response to higher coal costs.

Domestic demand for ceramic tiles rose a slight 2% YoY in 4Q22 – in tandem with the rise in renovation activities – while demand for other building materials used in the construction/repair of roofing, ceilings, and walls increased stronger at 11% YoY. SCC's total ceramic tiles sales volumes in Thailand and other ASEAN markets declined 3% YoY to 39m sq m. Due to the higher proportion from high-margin products, ceramic tile ASPs under the company's ASEAN operations rose 10% YoY.

4Q22 revenue increased 7% YoY, driven by higher sales revenues in both Thailand and ASEAN based on the company's strategic successes. Due to the large amount of asset impairments recorded in 4Q22, SCC posted a net loss of THB717m. Excluding this extra item, there should be a core loss of THB157m – mainly due to the higher levels of energy utilised and raw material costs.

Petrochemicals business continuing its deep low cycle

Naphtha costs in 4Q22 declined by 6% QoQ to USD673 per tonne – in tandem with Brent crude oil prices declining 9% QoQ to USD89 per bbl. This was due to rising concerns over a global economic recession and an increasing number of pandemic cases in China.

Although naphtha prices declined moderately in 4Q22, HDPE prices fell 6% QoQ to USD1,033 per tonne. Meanwhile, PP prices declined 9% QoQ to USD975 per tonne. These prices of major polyolefins were pressured by global inventory destocking, China's lockdowns, and a low season situation. Therefore, HDPE-naphtha shrank 7% QoQ to USD361 per tonne while PP-naphtha spreads also fell 16% QoQ to USD302 per tonne. Even worse, SCC's polyolefin sales volumes declined sharply to 331,000 tonnes (-33% YoY, -22% QoQ) in 4Q22 due to weak demand and the turnaround of Rayong Olefins' cracker.

4Q22 revenue declined to THB43.4bn (-34% YoY, -25% QoQ) mainly due to slower demand hitting both sales volumes and polyolefin prices. In addition, there was an inventory loss of THB510m recorded during the quarter to reflect lower naphtha prices. 4Q22 bottomline performance continued to post a loss (at -THB1.05bn) due to shrinking product spreads and YoY lower equity income from associates (-35% YoY, +35% QoQ).

Packaging unit showing a slash negative surprise

For the integrated packaging chain, 4Q22 revenue declined sharply to THB25.3bn (-17% YoY, -13% QoQ), mainly due to sluggish demand in China and ASEAN, which pressured on lower levels of packaging paper sales volumes and product prices. Regional markets have been much affected by:

- i. The contraction of China's economic activities, which led to high levels of excess containerboard supply especially in Vietnam and Indonesia;
- ii. Slower demand for durable goods and exported products to major markets eg the US and Europe amid consumers' lower disposable incomes due to prolonged hyperinflation.

However, the polymer and fibre packaging businesses were partially supported by gradual improvements in consumer-related packaging demand from the F&B and fast-moving consumer goods or FMCG segments, which align with the tourism-backed domestic consumption recovery. Therefore, 4Q22 profit from this chain declined 46% YoY (-61% QoQ) to THB512m.

For the fibrous chain segment, 4Q22 revenue increased 30% YoY to THB6.85bn (flattening QoQ). This was mainly due to the improvement in demand and capacity expansions of foodservice packaging in Thailand and Vietnam, as well as higher market price of pulp and printing & writing paper. Meanwhile, the improvement in sales volumes and prices for foodservice packaging – amidst a rebound in tourism – helped support the demand for quick service restaurants or QSRs. In addition, the demand for printing and writing paper also improved due to the resumption of schools and re-opening of offices.

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4Q22 net profit from this chain decreased a significant 91% YoY to THB107m as 4Q21's performance included the adjustment impact of Go-Pak UK's earn-out provision. Excluding this adjustment, profit declined 81% YoY due to the decrease in sales volumes (especially of dissolving pulp exports to China), major maintenance activities in 4Q22, and tax expense adjustments related to changes in the UK's corporate income tax rate.


