### Overall ESG Score: 3.30 (out of 4)

BEM has assured that the expressway users are provided with convenient, fast, safe services, by which the economic losses caused by fuel burning in the course of traffic congestion can be minimised. As for the metro system, in addition to safe, convenient, fast services provided to users, it is also an eco-friendly public transport system that consumes clean energy, helps minimise air pollution, and reduces greenhouse gas and carbon dioxide emissions.

#### S: EXCELLENT

BEM has carried out activities based on responsibility for impact its business has had on communities and the society. It also participates in helping to develop and maintain the well-being of communities. Its guidelines for operations on care for and collaborations in community development are divided into three target groups: i) Origin (communities surrounding the workplaces), ii) middle-way (communities along the service routes), and iii) destination (society as a whole).

#### **G: EXCELLENT**

The structure and agility of BEM's governance is essential to ensure consistency in: i) Strategic risk management; and ii) giving critical, accurate and timely information throughout the entire IT governance system. This is so that BEM can maximise efficiency in managing resources. in response to the ever-changing business environment.

## Bangkok Expressway and Metro (BEM TB)

### Full Recovery Lying Ahead; Maintain BUY

- Maintain BUY, higher SOP-based THB11 TP from THB9.90, 16% upside and >1% yield. Post 3Q22's net profit results, we can see that the organic growth from the recovery of expressway traffic and mass rapid transit (MRT) ridership has clearly been outstanding - especially when the pandemic situation is taming down. Although both numbers have not yet reached the previous pre-pandemic highs, these solid trends will continue in FY23. We expect the bright prospects to bode well for the core businesses during the back-to-normal commuting activities.
- Organic growth never stops. The key highlight Bangkok Expressway and Metro in the meantime is the recovery speed of both its transportation modes. Expressway traffic improved very quickly immediately after the pandemic situation started to tame down. However, it has not reached the saturation level of 1.2m trips/day normally seen during the pre-COVID-19 quarters. In contrast, the Blue Line MRT's ridership improved moderately during this same period but has improved faster since May when the Government began to partially unlock restrictions. Based on BEM's 10M22 data, expressway traffic has inched up from 937k trips/day in January to 1.08m trips/day in October - the 10M22 average grew 26% YoY to 1.03m/day. Blue Line MRT ridership has increased more sharply from 175k trips/day in January to 342k trips/day in October while the 10M22 average grew 86% YoY to 254k trips/day.
- Stronger potential to continue in FY23. In spite of both indicators being still lower than pre-pandemic levels, there is some good news expressway traffic and MRT ridership on some weekdays since October have already reached per day trip numbers of 1.2m and >400k. This may imply that both numbers may hit new highs within FY23 when commuting activities look set to normalise on a full-year basis. Based on management's guidance, expressway traffic will return to the saturation level of c.1.2m trips/day within 2Q23. Meanwhile, BEM believes MRT ridership will reach a new high at c.500k trips/day within 2023.
- Earnings revision. We revise down our FY22F earnings by 10% to THB2.64bn (+161% YoY) to reflect the slower-than-expected expressway traffic. Therefore, our new assumption for expressway traffic declined by 6% to 1.03m trips/day. Meanwhile, we inch up our assumption for MRT ridership by 9% to 275k trips/day. A fast recovery in MRT ridership also triggered us to revise up our FY23F earnings by 14% to THB3.56bn (+35% YoY).
- Based on our in-house proprietary methodology, we have assigned an ESG score of 3.3 for BEM. As the score is on par with the country median, we assign a 0% premium/discount to arrive at our higher DCF-based THB11 TP. Maintain BUY




