Siam Cement (SCC TB, BUY, TP: THB440.00)

Well Prepared For The Upturn; BUY

Company Update

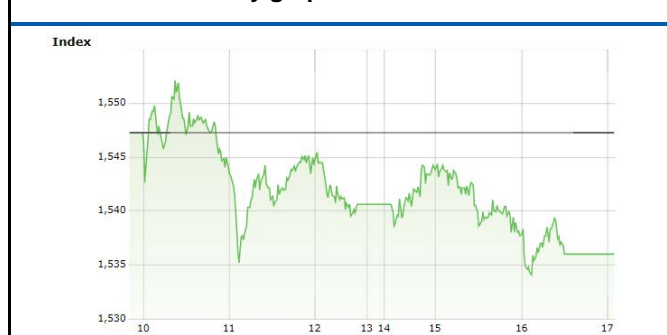
BUY, with higher DCF-based THB440.00 TP from THB420.00, 13% upside and c.4% yield. Siam Cement's earnings have improved since 2Q20, supported by a recovery in the petrochemical business, and consistently growing demand for packaging. Its cement & building materials unit saw its peak period in 1H20. We expect the petrochemical and packaging units to play a critical role in FY21. Our new TP reflects the brighter business prospects after FY20, as we shift 10-year forecast horizon to FY21-30.

Hospitality Minor International (MINT TB)	<p>Association of Domestic Travel (ADT) President Thanapol Cheewarattanaporn said the Government's domestic tourism goal of 200m trips this year is achievable, though it depends on state support via more stimulus plans. Cheewarattanaporn said operators would like the Government to flatten the infection rate curve from the hundreds daily to double digits or even a single digit by February to revive travel confidence. The goal is to revive interprovincial trips by March, starting with low-risk areas. Around 70% of ADT's 750 members emerged from the lockdown in 3Q20, but the resurgence of the virus affected them again, as less than 20% are operating now.</p> <p>The association also proposed a new idea for co-payment for domestic tour programmes, with the Government subsidising 50% of tour packages, capped at THB3,000 for 2m packages. The scheme should be launched by April and will be valid for four months. Tourism activities will halt for two months to contain the virus.</p> <p>With this scheme, domestic tourism stands a chance to reach 200m trips, which can sustain the whole supply chain after hotel and airline subsidies were launched earlier. This project follows local tourism patterns, as domestic trips are expected to be concentrated for the rest of the year, given the uncertainties over vaccine effectiveness and policies to allow in foreign visitors from various countries. The Tourism & Sports Ministry reported local travellers took 78.3m trips during Jan-Nov 2020, generating THB430bn. The high for domestic trips was 167m in 2019, contributing THB1.08trn. <i>(Bangkok Post)</i></p>	<p>The proposed co-payment for domestic tour programmes may attract locals and support hotel bookings this year. However, we think the expected 200m trips for domestic tourism for 2021 target may be too optimistic, as this number will exceed pre-pandemic levels, while the resurgence of COVID-19 may limit purchasing power. Additionally, with local trips only resuming in April, the Tourism Authority's 2021 forecasts of 120m trips (+33%) and THB700bn receipts (+27%) are more likely, in our view.</p> <p>We believe the second wave of the pandemic may cause Thai hoteliers to deliver steeper negative earnings QoQ in 1Q21, before the momentum improves in the following quarters. Minor International (MINT) remains our Top Pick for the sector, based on its business and location diversifications globally, as well as its rapid response in coping with the changes in the operating environment.</p> <p>We maintain our call and TP on MINT, as well as the hospitality sector as a whole.</p>	<p>Sector: UNDERWEIGHT</p> <p>Stock: MINT: TRADING BUY, TP: THB27.00</p>

While we expect the normalisation of prepaid segment demand, subs acquisition activities and easing competition to gradually drive topline to recovery in 2H20, we think a value-to-money strategy through a bundling package should continue to yield additional revenue to the group The toning down of capex guidance should ease investor concern over the imminent margins pressure, We expect the impact from the roll-out of 5G network to be limited, as it should be partially absorbed by network cost saving initiative, staggered payment profile, and tax incentive scheme
Bangkok Chain Hospital (BCH TB)	17.50	26.81	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We still expect to see robust COVID-19 screening services demand throughout 2H20 on the continuous return of students studying abroad, migrant workers, and business travellers after border restrictions are relaxed. The doubling of its capacity under the alternative state quarantine should boost upside from this new revenue stream and bolster FY20 earnings We expect to see strong 2H20 recovery in Social Security Office or SSO revenue, driven by the resumption of pent-up demand from high-cost care, trauma, and dental services. We also think global budget disbursements could bring further upsides this year, thanks to relatively lower insured patients traffic during the pandemic
Bangkok Expressway & Metro (BEM TB)	11.50	40.24	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Its expressway unit has recovered rapidly in terms of traffic numbers and is currently approaching pre-pandemic levels The Blue-Line Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) is underway towards a recovery towards pre-pandemic levels. Although the recovery seems slow, organic growth in this business will be more aggressive than growth in the expressway unit. This is because the full-loop network of the Blue-Line MRT is currently in operation
Central Pattana (CPN TB)	58.00	16.58	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Improving sentiment for its retail mall operations, based on indirect benefits from the year-end tax rebate for shopping campaigns Rental rate discounts may marginally improve, with no material impact from temporary political rallies, on store traffic Efficient cost control measures have lowered its variable and fixed costs, mainly utility and marketing expenses, while profit margins are likely on the uptrend on the back of reviving retail mall operations Residential business sees stronger sales momentum in 4Q20 – the industry's high season – based on more high-rise unit transfers, along with low-rise projects in Bangkok and upcountry
CH Karnchang (CK TB)	22.50	38.04	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The company's orderbooks turnaround can be anticipated within the near term For the construction work of the west side route, as well as the operations and maintenance concessions for the entire route, CK partnered with its associate. It will be the frontrunner due to its experience in constructing and operating underground MRT networks The Luang Prabang hydropower project should be next and negotiations will likely be concluded soon. With a construction size of THB80-90bn – comparable to Xayaburi – this project's construction will span a 7-year period and start contributing to revenue in FY22
CP ALL (CPALL TB)	77.00	29.41	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> V-shaped earnings recovery, with continued opening of new stores, while Siam Makro's operations remain solid As it has the most extensive store network, CPALL may strongly benefit the new normal in terms of facilitating delivery of products and services through its developing omni-channel platform Still the best-in-class retailer with intact new store opening plan. Expect full-year earnings returning to pre-pandemic levels in 2021 To finance the acquisition of Tesco Lotus with a combination of debt and perpetual debentures to balance its leverage
Home Product Center (HMPRO TB)	17.00	23.19	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Expecting normalising earnings in FY21 – to be supported by full-year operations of all stores and retail malls vs a temporary closure from late March to mid-May, with profit margins approaching pre-pandemic levels HMPRO's investment in Vietnam may strongly benefit growing urbanisation and a potential rise in the construction sector Quarterly earnings momentum will continue its upward trajectory in 1Q21 Rapid improvement in sustainability development may allow the stock to continue trading at a premium

Osotspa PCL (OSP TB)	49.00	37.06	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> C-Vitt Vitamin C drinks' popularity and its production hike to strengthen domestic sales amid a U-shaped recovery for OSP's local energy drinks Full-year operations of its beverage filling facilities in Myanmar to improve market penetration and profit margins in 2021, while the highly efficient "Fit Fast Firm" corporate cost-savings programme should continue strengthening its profit margins Seeking inorganic growth via partnerships, as well as both vertical and horizontal integrations

WHA Corp (WHA TB)	3.80	22.58	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> WHA should be the major local industrial estate player that turns around its industrial land sales business, especially after international travel restrictions are lifted in FY21. This is while its recurring-income units – including utility services and rental spaces – provide downside protection for its earnings prospects Top industries that will dominate the next foreign direct investment cycle include: i) Auto & parts, ii) electronics, iii) consumer products, and iv) medical products. The latter, in our view, will bode well for WHA's premium warehouse spaces, while auto & parts, electronics, and consumer products can spur demand for its industrial land and conventional warehouse spaces

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
