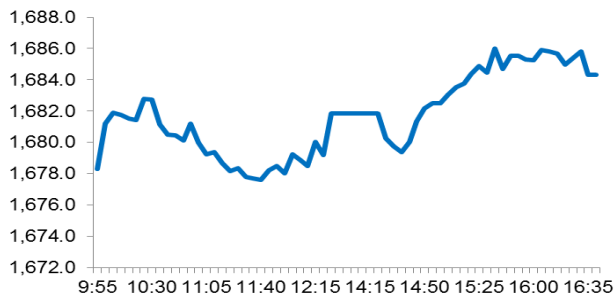

Berli Jucker (BJC TB)	<p>Berli Jucker presented its medium-term business outlook on Monday (28 Mar) where it announced it was targeting THB270bn in sales over the next five years. Key focuses include: i) The opening of smaller store formats and providing more accessibility for customers in upcountry areas, ii) expansion opportunities in South-East Asia (ie Vietnam, Cambodia, and Myanmar), iii) growing omni-channel sales to the low teens in 2026 from 3% in 2021, and iv) developing products and supplier platforms. Capex over 2022-2026 has been set at c.THB12bn pa. Of this figure, 70% will be for the modern retail supply chain while 20% has been earmarked for the packaging supply chain.</p> <p>By 2026, BJC's total stores target for Thailand include 160 Big C hypermarkets (2021: 153), 2,853 Mini Big Cs (2021: 1,352), and 84 supermarkets (2021: 59). For operations abroad, the company's 5-year goal will be to run six hypermarkets (2021: one) and 276 Mini Big Cs (2021: one) in Cambodia, two hypermarkets (2021: zero) and 245 Mini Big Cs (2021: 57) in Laos, and 113 MM Mega Market wholesale outlets (2021: 25) in Vietnam. Based on this, BJC expects total sales to possibly achieve THB270bn in 2026. (Company)</p>	<p>This guidance comes amidst a rising competitive environment among major local staple/grocery retailers. It may act as a concrete plan to secure BJC's longer-term business directions and outlook, and could be short-term positive to sentiment on this stock in our view. The company's modern retail supply chain's acceleration in the opening of new stores and planned enhancement of existing properties may support the post-COVID-19 business recovery in terms of both merchandise sales and recurring income. Factoring in this expansion may also create upside to its earnings forecasts from 2023 onwards.</p> <p>2022 may be the year of recovery for BJC, with our expected core profit growth of 42% (2021: -23%) to THB4.87bn based on 4% total sales growth, wider GPMS (+0.2ppts), and recurring income growth by 14%. Revenue may also improve at all its business supply chains following the demand revival post the easing of lockdown measures. However, rising production costs – mainly raw materials – may challenge BJC's ability to maintain profit margins for its packaging and consumer products manufacturing this year.</p> <p>We currently maintain our TP and recommendation on this stock.</p>	<p>NEUTRAL, TP: THB37.00</p>

Its banking and capital businesses still have the potential to grow with quality Preview of 1Q22. We expect 1Q22 net profit to rise QoQ, underpinned by lower provisions and opex, higher loan growth, and fee income We raise FY22-23F earnings by 8-10% to be in line with KKP's FY22 targets.
