Airports of Thailand (AOT TB)

Buy (Maintained)

Accelerated 2QFY23 Results; Keep BUY

Target Price (Return): THB82 (11.9%)
 Price (Market Cap): THB73.25 (USD30,798m)
 ESG score: 3.40 (out of 4)
 Avg Daily Turnover (THB/USD) 1,244m/36.2m

- **Keep BUY and FY23F (Sep) TP of THB82, 12% upside and c.1% yield.** 2QFY23 (Sep)'s results – which turned around YoY and continued to improve QoQ – were impressive. They were mainly driven by the recoveries in international flight and passenger numbers, which boosted Airports of Thailand's topline growth and beat the cost hikes. We expect stronger earnings momentum in 3QFY23 given the ongoing return of Chinese visitors and better concession revenues as key drivers.
- **2QFY23 earnings momentum continued.** AOT reported its 2QFY23 results last Friday with a core profit of THB1.92bn – a further turnaround from the THB3.36bn in losses in 2QFY22 and a 341% QoQ jump. This was above consensus estimates. Ongoing beneficiaries from Thailand's full reopening from 1 Oct 2022 onwards, the return of Chinese flights and passengers, and high season for Thailand's tourism sector were the key factors, boosting international travel and allowing the company's operations to improve.
- **Strong topline momentum.** Revenue totalled THB11bn (+265% YoY, +25% QoQ), driven by both aeronautical and commercial activities – it was also at 64% of 2QFY19's levels. Total aircraft movement and passenger numbers for the quarter were 70% and 68% of 2QFY19's levels – these were improvements from 1QFY23's 67% and 63% of 1QFY20's levels.
- **Profit margins uptrend.** 2QFY23 GPM also turned positive YoY and expanded QoQ to 34% while EBITDA margin continued to stay in positive territory for a third consecutive quarter. This was thanks to the strong topline growth that beat an 8% QoQ increase in combined employee, utilities, and outsourcing costs. The opex-to-sales ratio fell 0.4ppts QoQ.
- **ESG framework update.** As there is now greater focus on the E pillar on critical climate change issues, we tweaked our ESG weightage. Henceforth, we assign a 50% weightage to the E pillar, followed by 25% each to the S and G pillars (see our [2 May thematic research](#) for more details). AOT's ESG score declined to 3.4 from 3.6 and we have applied a lower 4% ESG premium to its intrinsic value vs 6% previously to derive our rolled-over THB82 TP for the next 12-month investment horizon. As a first-tier proxy to the tourism recovery, AOT is still our Top Pick for the Thai hospitality sector.

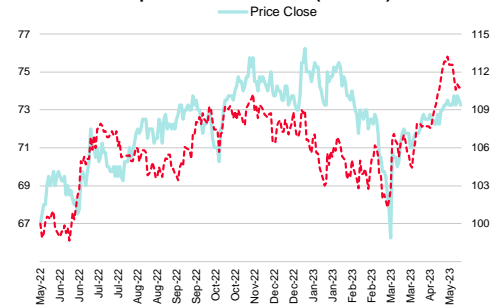

E: EXCELLENT

All AOT air transport projects are required to prepare environment impact assessment reports following a mandate from the Ministry of Natural Resources & Environment. It strictly follows measurements on environmental prevention, impact minimisation and monitoring, ie air quality, noise levels, vibration, wastewater management, water quality, wildlife resources, biological marine resources, and public participation. It applies innovations or environmental technology to the entire airport system to reduce energy and resource consumption per capita.

S: EXCELLENT

All its airports carry out projects to support local communities, ie community-based tourism promotion and volunteer projects. It strictly follows International Civil Aviation Organisation's safety regulations with an auditing process in place. The airports also organise training sessions to help prepare for crisis or emergencies.

G: EXCELLENT

Over half of AOT's board comprise independent directors. The company stresses on the importance of information disclosure in an adequate, accurate, and timely manner. There is emphasis on transparency and sustainable long-term growth to ensure that shareholders' basic rights are upheld. Investors are also encouraged to attend shareholders meetings.

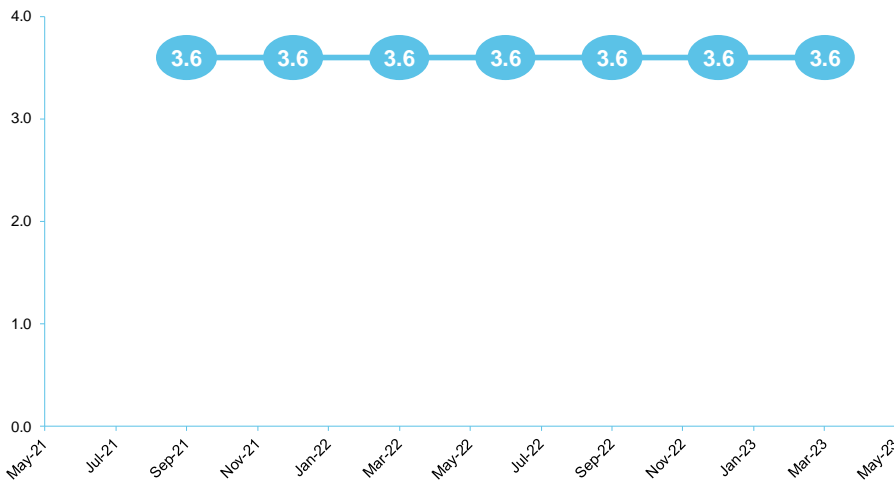
